4) Speaking Learners can say the word when you ask "what's that?".	"What"? or "What's this?"	Point to an object or picture, ask the learner " <u>What's this</u> ?"	Say the right word

actions. 2) Listen and show understanding Learners can do the correct action when you say the words.	"Now you" or "Show me"	Say the word, and get the learner to do the action (without showing them).	Do the action. Don't speak.
3) Repeating Learners repeat the words after you, while doing the action.	"Repeat." or "You speak."	Do the action and <u>ask the learner to</u> repeat the word after you.	Repeat each word after the teacher. Do the action.
4) Speaking Learners can say the word when you ask "what am I doing?"	"What"? or "What's this?" or "What am I doing?"	Do the action <u>and ask the learner what</u> you are doing.	Say the right word. Do the action.
